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# Introduction

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The *Utah Counties Fact Book* is published yearly by the Utah Association of Counties and is meant to provide county officials, state agencies, associations, private organizations, and citizens with a compilation of useful, county-relevant data. The information in this book describes the economic, demographic, public safety, and financial characteristics of each of Utah's 29 counties.
