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Introduction

The *Utah Counties Fact Book* is published yearly by the Utah Association of Counties and is meant to provide county officials, state agencies, associations, private organizations, and citizens with a compilation of useful, county-relevant data. To this end, we've collected data from several federal, state, and county level governments. The information in this book describes the economic, demographic, public safety, and financial characteristics of each of Utah's 29 counties.
