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OVERVIEW:

Under direct supervision of the Site Supervisor(s), performs a variety of skilled work in the compacting, loading and moving of refuse within a refuse transfer station site. Secondary responsibilities include assisting the work of Site Spotters which include directing the entry and exit of commercial and private vehicles, and directing drivers on where and how to park and any other floor activity performed.

YOUR RESPONSIBILITIES:

Operates heavy equipment including the 966 and 950 Loaders, excavators, skid steers and other potential equipment.

Checks and services assigned equipment; performs routine maintenance and emergency repairs; submits reports as required; reports mechanical problems for repairs. Performs required manual labor involved in removing solid waste from the Transfer Station totally each day and performs routine cleaning of Transfer Station daily. Performs the task of directing the entry and exit of commercial and private vehicles and directing drivers on where and how to park. Operates computer system located in the scale house for weighing in and out of haulers for billing. Must count money and make change accurately. Performs related work as required and assigned.

ABOUT YOU:

Education: Completion of High school or equivalent,

Experience: One year of heavy equipment operation or road work experience or, any equivalent combination of education and experience.

Knowledge: Knowledge of heavy equipment principles and practices; some knowledge of the common hazards and safety precautions relating to equipment operations; knowledge of department policies; knowledge of the safety measures required while working with various tools on the job; knowledge of flagging procedures for the safety of fellow employees and the general public.

Skills: Operation of assigned equipment. Excellent public relations.

Abilities: Operate assigned equipment under varying conditions; ability to perform minor equipment maintenance and repair; ability to learn and follow standard safety practices and procedures common to equipment operation work; ability to follow written and verbal instructions; ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with employees and the general public.

YOUR SPECIAL QUALIFICATIONS:

Must possess or be able to possess a valid Utah driver's license; may be subject to 24 hour calls depending on emergencies. May be required to have access to an operating telephone or equivalent method of contact in case of emergency. Must be willing to work ten (10) hour shifts which may include a four (4) hour shift on Sunday. Must be able to count money and make change accurately. Incumbent must live sufficiently close to the Transfer Station to respond to an emergency within a reasonable period of time. Preference will be given to applicants living in, or willing to relocate to Weber County. Applicants who are selected for employment with Weber County will be required to submit an up-to-date copy of their Motor Vehicle Record from the Utah State License Division prior to starting work. Motorized vehicles and equipment, including 966 and 950 loader, skid steer, utility truck, excavator, common hand and power tools, shovels mobile and portable radio, phone. Computer equipment connected to scales for loading of transfer trailers and scale house operation.
